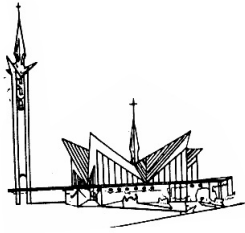

LEARN-TO-HEART HYMN...This Advent season, we will sing hymn 375 - "Come, Your Hearts and Voices Raising" by Paul Gerhardt.

About the Author: Paul Gerhardt (b. Gräfenheinen, Saxony, Germany, 1607; d. Lubben, Germany, 1676), famous author of Lutheran evangelical hymns, studied theology and hymnody at the University of Wittenberg and then was a tutor in Berlin, where he became friends with Johann Crüger. He served the Lutheran parish of Mittenwalde near Berlin (1651-1657) and the great St. Nicholas' Church in Berlin (1657-1666). Friederich William, the Calvinist elector, had issued an edict that forbade the various Protestant groups to fight each other. Although Gerhardt did not want strife between the churches, he refused to comply with the edict because he thought it opposed the Lutheran "Formula of Concord," which condemned some Calvinist doctrines. Consequently, he was released from his position in Berlin in 1666. With the support of friends, he became an archdeacon in Lubben in 1669 and remained there until his death. Gerhardt experienced much suffering in his life; he and his parishioners lived in the era of the Thirty Years' War, and his family experienced incredible tragedy: four of his five children died young, and his wife died after a prolonged illness. In the history of hymnody, Gerhardt is considered a transitional figure who wrote when hymns changed from a more objective, confessional, and corporate focus to a pietistic, devotional, and personal one. Like other German hymns, Gerhardt's were lengthy and intended for use throughout a service, a group of stanzas at a time. More than 130 of his hymns were published.

LUTHERANS FOR LIFE 2025 MICHIGAN ESSAY CONTEST:

Lutherans for Life and Lutherans for Life of Michigan are holding their annual Life Essay Contests for 6th - 8th grade students and for high school students. For the LFL of MI contest there are awards of \$150 for 1st place and \$100 for 2nd place for each of the two grade levels. First place winner's essays in the LFL of MI contests are entered in the National LFL contest where the 1st and 2nd place winners receive additional awards and benefits as described in the Essay Contest Guidelines. Each LCMS school or congregation may submit one essay for each of the two grade levels as explained in the contest guidelines. If you are interested in reviewing these guidelines, please contact Norm Long at 616-698-9437 to receive a copy. Essays must be received by our contest coordinator by February 28, 2025. In recent years very few essays have been received, but those received were well written and reflected a good deal of research done by the students. With all the false information that is being presented to young people, it is important to encourage them to sort out the lies and find the truth and we believe that participating in the Life Essay Contest is one way to encourage them. The Board of LFL of MI ask that you seriously consider asking students to participate in the contest and offer them your assistance or direct them to another person that can do so. It has been suggested that students be encouraged to use the latter portion of their Christmas break to prepare the first drafts of their essays.
